



**Lumber

river basin.**




**Catawba

of any North Carolina river.*




**French Broad

a 50-foot waterfall in Transylvania County.**




**Little Tennessee

river basin.**




**Chowan

its fertile soils.**




**This basin contains 72 plant



trout country.








*White Oak

This basin contains over half of the 160,000-acre Croatan National Forest, which hosts the largest population of carnivorous plants of any national forest.




Broad River Basin

“Last of the Mohicans”




Roanoke

lives




Pasquotank

basins.




Neuse

borders




Yadkin-Pee Dee
